Step 1: Teachers Create Classes & Add Students

Step 2: Students Take the Pre-test Assessment

Teachers Introduce ReadTheory to Students

Teachers guide students through logging into readtheory.org for the first time.

Students Take the Pre-test Assessment

Teachers should allow 20–30 minutes of class time for students to complete the assessment.

Step 3: Set Weekly Goals & Expectations

To maximize the impact of ReadTheory, teachers should set clear expectations and goals with students. **We recommend students:**

- Gain 100 Knowledge Points (KPs) per week or
- Complete 7 quizzes per week

Note. Spending approximately 20 minutes per day on ReadTheory fosters consistent reading practice and growth. Students who engage regularly with ReadTheory achieve a 15+ point advantage on state reading assessment scores.

Pro Tip: Assign a Recurring Weekly Activity (on the activities tab) – Establish a routine and set clear expectations based on quizzes passed or completed.



Step 4: Track Growth

- See Lexile® and Grade Level progress for each student
- Check quiz accuracy and number of quizzes completed
